#### **Objectives**

The objectives of the workshops are the following:

- disseminate and foster better understanding of the OECD recommendations on the integrity and transparency of the procurement process of the New International Airport of Mexico City project (NAICM);
- raise awareness of corruption risks among NAICM partners and staff, particularly among those working in at-risk areas of the procurement process;
- provide a forum for the GACM (Airport Group of Mexico City) to discuss and consult with governmental (SFP, COFECE, Internal Control Unit) and non-governmental stakeholders (private sector, civil society, academic experts) on the next steps to enhance integrity and transparency;
- share international good practices on public sector integrity from other OECD member and partner countries to further support GACM in delivering on its mandate;
- share relevant OECD analytical frameworks and instruments on public sector integrity.
